





Explore EPMA's permanent collection, get inspired and turn these black and white pages into colorful art pieces.

Steps


- 1 Print out the coloring pages.




Jose Lozano, Recortando a Frida (Cutting out frida), 2005. GLicee print, 39.5 in x 31.75. El Paso Museum of Art.
